It starts with a dog or coyote or wolf with heartworms. Heartworms mate inside infected dogs and produce **millions** of microscopic babies that live in the bloodstream.



When a mosquito bites an infected dog, heartworm babies are sucked up along with her blood meal.

For the next **10-14** days, the mosquito provides a nursery for the heartworm babies in her body. The babies develop into larvae and travel to the mouthpiece of the mosquito. The next stop? **Your pet**.

By 6 months after infection, heartworms are mature and 12 or more inches long.

They begin mating, starting the cycle all over again. And they continue to live and produce offspring for up to 7 years. Ś,

HOW DO DOGS GET HEARTWORMS?

When the infected mosquito bites a pet, the heartworm larvae enter through the bite site, making their way to the bloodstream.

Within **7-10** weeks, they reach the pulmonary arteries, heart and lungs, where they can cause serious disease.
