FACT: Cats DO get heartworm disease.

Although heartworm infection is diagnosed more often in dogs, studies show unprotected cats are vulnerable too. Keeping cats indoors is not enough to prevent cats from being bitten by mosquitoes that carry heartworms.

Cases of feline heartworm disease have been reported in all 50 US states. No approved medical treatment is available for cats, and the disease can be fatal.
