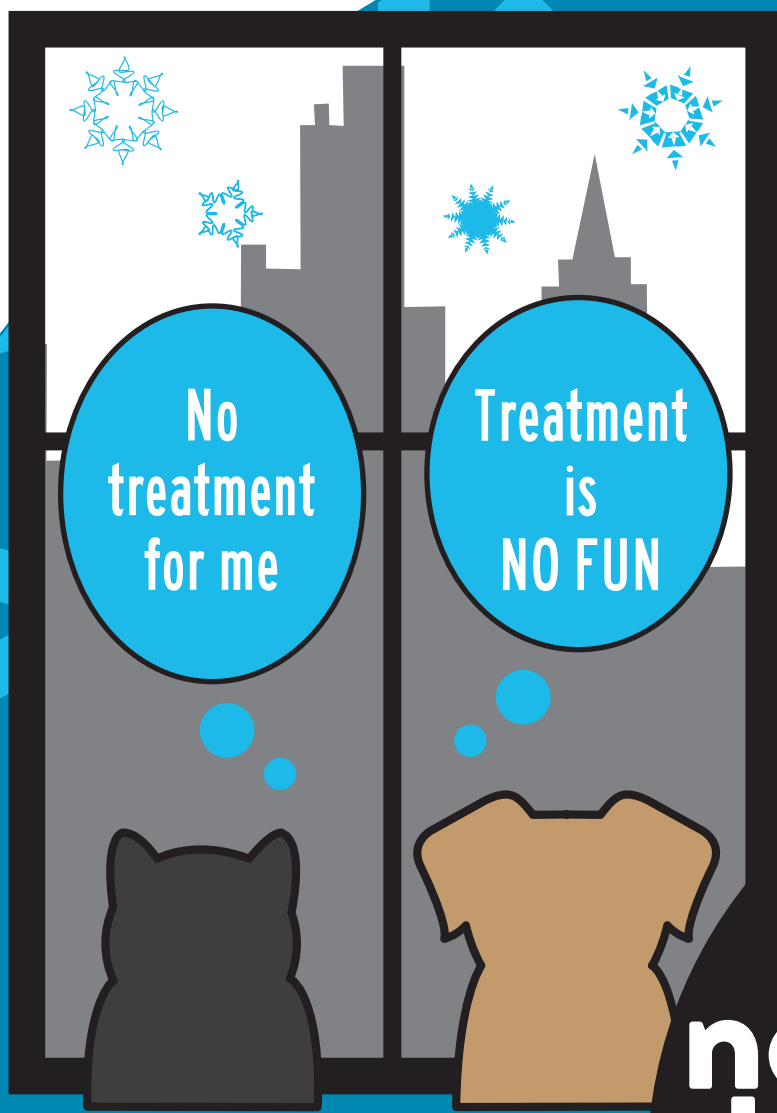


# Year-round prevention saves lives.

# Hear that whine?

Heartworms are spread by mosquitoes and just **1** female mosquito can lay up to **500** eggs in her lifetime. The more mosquitoes, the greater the chances for heartworm to spread.



# Don't take a timeout on prevention.

Many heartworm preventives protect pets from other parasites besides heartworms that threaten pets **year-round**. Meanwhile, urban spaces provide "heat islands" of warmth that shelter active mosquitoes.



# The seasons are changing.

According to the journal *Geophysical Research Letters*, summers are **hotter and longer**, while winter, spring and fall are shorter. The result? More days when mosquitoes are active and transmitting heartworms.
